



Tentative Course Offerings

Fall 2023

<i>Government & Economics</i>	This course studies both government and economics in unison. Students will delve into a variety of economic basics, such as supply and demand, sources of prosperity, the role of private property, and the role of government.
<i>Professional Communications</i>	Providing instruction in essential communication skills required for any promising professional, this course focuses on preparation and delivery of effective visual and verbal information designed to capture an audience. This is not a speech and debate class.
<i>Business Accounting</i>	This course introduces basic accounting principles for business. Upon completion, students can aptly apply their accounting skills to a business or organization.
<i>Know What You Believe</i>	Students will gain insight into how to answer questions such as: What do all religions in the world have in common? Is there proof the Bible is true, and correct? Conversation will be based around how to rationalize those answers.
<i>Faith, Film & Dialogue</i>	Faith, Film & Dialogue provides a systematic analysis of cinema as a modern art form, its impact on today's culture, and the Christian's engagement with film.
<i>To Change the World</i>	Covering the topics of creativity, leadership, work, business, and the true nature of God's mission in the world, this course helps students discuss and define purpose in life.
<i>Podcasting</i>	Students will gain an understanding of audio storytelling thus recognizing the podcast medium as an intimate form of storytelling. Using these storytelling tools, students will create a podcast episode.
<i>Digital Storytelling</i>	Learn the art of telling a compelling story with video by training in the fundamentals of storytelling, video production, and digital distribution.
<i>Logical Reasoning</i>	This course provides students with an introduction to logical reasoning and critical thinking. Examples from theology, philosophy, history, literature, culture, politics, economics, mathematics, and natural science are used to demonstrate how to use these reasoning skills to dialogue with others in the pursuit of truth.

Essential Math Skills for Decision Making This unique and engaging course will take you through a set of math skills essential for life and career decision making. The prerequisite for this course is proficiency in Arithmetic.

Emotional Intelligence Through application of the EQ-i2.0 assessment, students practice how to identify the impact and intersection of emotional and social skills in their workplace and life.

Cultural Connections In this course, students will learn to better understand our own culture and values before discovering those of others. The course will also develop a framework to decipher culture while preparing ourselves for behavioral changes that will help us flourish wherever we find ourselves facing a culture other than our own.

Career Orienteering A career mapping course to guide students through defining a destination, building skills, setting goals, and networking to discover their career paths.
